Vermont Application for Extension of Time to File Form IN-111



- This form must be filed if you are unable to file your Vermont Income Tax Return by the due date of April 15, 2024 and you are not filing a federal extension or if you are required to make an extension payment.
An extension only allows additional time to file the Vermont Income Tax Return and avoids a late filing penalty. If tax is due, you must pay it by the April due date. Interest and late payment penalty accrue from April 15 to the date of payment.
NOTE: This extension does not apply to Form HS-122, Vermont Homestead Declaration OR Property Tax Credit Claim. Form HS-122 is due April 15 of the current year. Late-filed Homestead Declarations will be charged a late filing penalty up to 8% of the corrected education tax by the town.
