

2019 Estimated Tax Worksheet, Line 6a Phaseout of Itemized / Standard Deductions Worksheet 36 M.R.S. 5124-C(2) and 5125(7)

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You must use this Worksheet to calculate the reduction of your standard deduction amount or itemized deduction amount if your estimated Maine adjusted gross income for 2019 is greater than \$81,450 if single or married filing separately; \$122,200 if head of household; or \$162,950 if married filing jointly or qualifying widow(er).

1.	Enter your estimated 2019 Maine adjusted gross income	
2.	Enter \$81,450 if single or married filing separately; \$122,200 if head of household; or 2 \$162,950 if married filing jointly or qualifying widow(er).	
3.	Subtract line 2 from line 1. If zero or less, do not complete this worksheet - your deduction is not subject to the phaseout	
4.	Enter \$75,000 if single or married filing separately; \$112,500 if head of household; or 4 \$150,000 if married filing jointly or qualifying widow(er).	
5.	Divide line 3 by line 4. If one or more, enter 1.0000	·
6.	Enter the 2019 standard deduction amount for your filing status or your total estimated 2019 Maine itemized deductions*, whichever applies	
7.	Multiply line 6 by line 57	
8.	Estimated 2019 Maine itemized deductions or standard deduction. Subtract line 7 from line 6. Enter this amount on your 2019 Estimated Tax Worksheet, line 6a	

*See Form 1040ME, Schedule 2 and related instructions. The maximum 2019 Maine itemized deductions that may be claimed (other than medical and dental expenses) is \$29,550 plus medical and dental expenses included in federal itemized deductions.
