1.	Enter your estimated 2021 Maine adjusted gross income	1
2.	Enter \$83,850 if single or married filing separately; \$125,750 if head of household; or \$ \$167,700 if married filing jointly or qualifying widow(er).	2
3.	Subtract line 2 from line 1. If zero or less, do not complete this worksheet - your deduction is not subject to the phaseout	3
4.	Enter \$75,000 if single or married filing separately; \$112,500 if head of household; or \$150,000 if married filing jointly or qualifying widow(er).	4
5.	Divide line 3 by line 4. If one or more, enter 1.0000.	5
6.	Enter the 2021 standard deduction amount for your filing status or your total estimated 2021 Maine itemized deductions*, whichever applies	6
7.	Multiply line 6 by line 5	7
8.	Estimated 2021 Maine itemized deductions or standard deduction. Subtract line 7 from line 6. Enter this amount on your 2021 Estimated Tax Worksheet, line 6a	8
